Volunteer Spotlight

Meet Jo Dwyer!

Jo has been volunteering as the steward for our Sowams Meadow property, we are so grateful for her time and support. Hear more from Jo about her connection to land conservation and why she volunteers.

"As a land steward, I get to spend time at the Sowams Meadow property, checking on conditions after storms, watching for animal signs, and getting familiar with this unique meadow habitat. I've always been happiest outside, and the marshes and meadows bring me the most joy. I worked for years as a nature educator and park ranger in marshlands, woods, and beaches, and I loved working with scientists to conserve, learn, and educate about natural places. When I learned I could work just a few hours a month with the Warren Land Trust, I thought it would be the perfect symbiosis!"



Preserve Updates

Throughout the beginning of 2024, the Warren Land Trust has been engaged in restoration and enhancement projects across our preserves. At the center of each is our core mission - to preserve and steward the natural resources of Warren to the benefit of both people and wildlife.

The WLT is proud to be a part of Warren's community fabric. We look forward to seeing you out on the trails - whether taking a walk, listening to the birds, or simply watching the sky.

At Haile Farm, trail restoration is always ongoing among record storms and tides. Volunteers, led by the preserve's land steward, Rock Singewald, have been instrumental in replacing boardwalks and removing debris from trails. Brush trimming and woodchip replacement has also been underway, supported by local Staton's Landscaping.

Jacob's Point

Jacob's Point continues to be an important habitat and outdoor space in the East Bay. In late 2023, crushed stone was installed in places along Marilyn's Trail to mitigate damage to the path during high tides. After the large storms and heavy rains in the past months, the stone has appeared to hold up well, preserving this coastal access point for the community.

We plan to keep a close eye on the effects of increasingly high tides here. In addition, in late March, a Purple Martin array was erected by volunteers, providing an additional nesting area within the salt marsh habitat. The Salt Marsh Sparrow Research Initiative will also continue its work at Jacob's Point this year, extending an important partnership with the WLT to monitor this rare species.



Sowams Meadows

In partnership with Save the Bay, the NRCS, and Staton's Landscaping, Sowams Meadows has continued to undergo extensive restoration work that began a few years prior.

In the last few months, Save the Bay has been actively digging runnels by hand and with light equipment in the salt marsh to promote water runoff after storms. The open fields have been cleared of invasives and carefully seeded with local native plants to, over time, build an extensive pollinator habitat. Bird boxes and bat houses have been installed in a few locations around the property you might even catch sight of them, or a few grazing deer, from Rt. 136!

Public access planning remains in the early stages - we have started design for a trail that meanders throughout the property, complete with interpretive and educational signage, sometime soon. Lastly, and perhaps most importantly, Joanna Dwyer has volunteered to act as steward on the WLT's newest

preserve.




